Explore *We'kwampekitk*, the Mi'kmag name for the Truro area, which means "the bay runs far up". This 18 km walking and cycling trail is located at the head of the Bay of Fundy, in central Colchester County.



The Cobequid Trail passes through a diversity of landscapes and habitats. Follow the rail trail between Old Barns and Truro, along the beautiful Cobequid Bay with salt marsh and mudflats, and the tidal Salmon River. Time your visit to see the tidal bore! Pass by marshlands and farms along the route. In Bible Hill and Valley, explore shaded brooks, hemlock ravines and woodlands of the Acadian Forest. Along the trail, watch for wildlife including Bald Eagle, Osprey, songbirds, migrating shorebirds, fox and deer.



The Cobequid Trail is great for bicycling, long distance running, leisurely walks and wildlife viewing. The trail has numerous rest areas with benches and picnic tables to enjoy the views.

What's in a Name?

The Mi'kmag call Cobequid Bay *We'kopekitk*, meaning "end of the flow".

The Acadian name for the area was *Cobeguit*. The Mi'kmaw word *awti'j* means "path, trail".
